

## ‘Some’ or ‘Any’

‘Any’ = negative sentences (‘not’), questions

**Ex 1:** I don’t want **any** beer.

**Ex 2:** Are there **any** tomatoes?

‘Some’ = positive sentences (+), questions *asking for* or *offering*

**Ex 3:** She has **some** friends.

**Ex 4:** Could I borrow **some** money please?

**Ex 5:** Would you like **some** fruit?
